The 11 rooms have rare pieces of antique furniture from the Dutch colonial period. "From vintage wallpaper drawn by local artists evoking the tropics, to furniture handcrafted by master artisans using age-old techniques preserved across the centuries. Each and every piece lends itself to the harmony and balance of the hotel interior," Tennakoon adds.



The architect who has contributed to the different stages of this building's history is Sri Lankan icon Channa Daswatte, while Tennakoon curated the decor, antiques

and art within the property.
